#### Overview:

The Monona Grove School District is seeking a qualified Teacher for the 2019-20 school year.

Monona Grove Liberal Arts Charter School for the 21st Century (MG21) is adding a Middle Campus to its high school beginning this fall. The MG21 Middle Campus is a multiage project based school designed to serve 40-50 students in grades 6-8. MG21 Middle Campus focuses on relationships, wellness and education for the whole child. Our school is committed to restorative practices, equity, social justice, mindfulness, outdoor wilderness education and stewardship in combination with rigorous academic skills.

#### Responsibilities:

- Collaborate with staff to create and develop a new middle school.
- Design and implement a project-based curriculum that includes reading, writing, math, science and the arts.
- Develop and facilitate project based activities.
- Promote wellness through outdoor leadership and environmental stewardship.
- Co-manage school related tasks (i.e. administrative, purchasing, community relations, etc.)
- Network within community to develop resources and contacts for PBL projects/Service Learning.
- Design and deliver curriculum for students' social emotional growth and wellness.
